

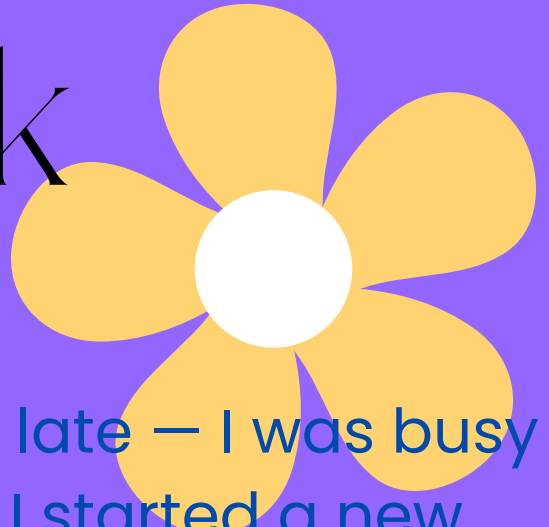

Thanks for reading! Stay curious and keep smiling

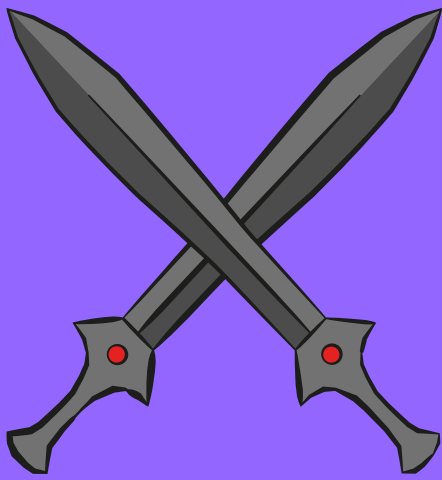

There is a serious conflict happening right now in the Middle East involving the United States, Israel, and Iran. What started in late February 2026 turned into an armed conflict after coordinated airstrikes were launched on Iran's military targets.

Since then, Iran has responded with missile and drone attacks on various sites in the region, and the fighting has continued into its fourth week. Both sides have issued strong warnings — for example, the United States has threatened to strike Iranian power plants if a key waterway called the Strait of Hormuz is not fully reopened, and Iran has warned of retaliation.

The Strait of Hormuz is very important because about 20% of the world's oil and gas travels through it, so any disruptions there affect energy prices and global trade.

Although this news can seem confusing or serious, it's good to know what's happening in the world so we understand how global events can affect many countries and people. Kidoscope prays the war ends soon and no more wars happen.
